

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

<u>EVENTS</u>

DAY 1-SEEDING RACES DAY 2- TEAM RELAYS DAY 3- OPEN RACES FOR JV TEAMS.

7 male runners & 7 female runners = 14 per varsity team

SEEDING RACES

- 1. All teams will designate their runners one through seven with one being the fastest. Coaches should seed runners according to their previous results or time trials. Seedings must be submitted with the AISA roster. Once the roster is submitted seedings can not be changed except for race ending injury or removal from the team.
- 2. There will be a total of six races on Day 1, three for boys and three for girls.
- 3. Each race will consist of only similarly seeded runners from all teams. The first race will be girls #1 & #2 seed runners. The second race will be boys # 1 & #2 runners. Race three will be girls #3 & #4 runners. Race four will be boys #3 & #4 runners. Race five will be girls #5-7 seeds and race six will be boys #5-7 seeds.
- 4. Scoring will be done per race. 1st place finish will receive 1 point, 2nd place finish 2 points, 3rd place finish 3 points, 4th place finish 4 points and so on. This will repeat for races one through 4. For the #5-7 seed race the first runner to finish from each team would receive point matching their place of finish, and would be the only one to score for that school in that race. The other two runners would be pushers.
- 5. The total for the seeding race for both boys and girls will make up two-thirds of the team total. The team relay race will make up the other third.

TEAM RELAY RACE

- 1. A full team relay team will consist of at least five full co-ed pairs of runners and no more than seven co-ed pairs of racers. The order of the race will go girl-boy-girl-boy.
- 2. Each runner will complete two legs of a 5km course (approx 2 laps at the KIS course).
- 3. An exchange zone shall be designated for team badge transfer to take place.
- 4. The order of finish will go according to the order each boy finishes his last leg. This will be the only time a runner goes through the shoot and crosses the finish line.
- 5. An invitational scoring system will be used. The first five pairs to complete the relay course will be scored and the sixth and seventh pairs will be pushers. The first pair to finish the relay course will receive 1 point, second 2 points, 3rd place 3 points, 4th place 4 points and so on.

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

OPEN RACE

This race will not be part of the scoring , but will be an exhibition race for the rest of the host country's teams. All runner JV and varsity are welcome to run. <u>No adults will be allowed to run in the open race</u>.

SCORING and AWARDS

Point from each seeding race and points from the relay race will be aded together. The team with the lowest point total will be the Overall AISA Team Champions (Traveling Plaque). The female racer with the fastest time will receive the "Best Female Runner" award (keeper plaque), and the male racer with the fastest time will receive the "Best Male Runner" award (keeper Plaque). The fastest female JV runner to finish will receive a medal and the fastest male JV runner to finish will receive a medal. Coaches will vote for AISA Sportsmanship award. Depending on your team's finish, coaches will choose runners from their own team to receive an All Tournament patch. If your team finishes 1st or 2nd you will choose 2 All Tournament runners. If you finish 5th, 6th or 7th you will choose 1 All Tournament runner.

TIE-BREAKER

If two teams are tied at the end of the relay race the first six-place pair in the relay race to cross the finish line would be the tie breaker.

Homestay Families:

Please communicate with your host families. Please let them know what time you will be at home, when you need to be picked up and where, and if you need dinner or not. Please feel free to let your host family know if you need anything and if there is a problem please let Mr. LaRue know. Be sure to have the school directions and phone numbers of the school, and the home address and phone numbers of your host with you at all times. Remember that curfew for ALL players is 10:00pm even the students that live in Korea. Coaches from each team are required to phone all of there players each night of the tournament to insure that players are in the host home by 10:00pm.

There is an area set up for eating food just behind the concession stand inside. Water will be provided around the race course for runners, managers, coaches and marshals.
