TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

AISA BOYS BASKETBALL RULES 2016

High School Federation rules will be employed throughout the tournament.

1. There will be four 8 minute periods in all games with 1 minute between quarters.
2. Each team will have a 10 minute warm-up before each game. Teams should be ready to get on the court as soon as the game before them is done.
3. There will be a 10 minute half-time for each game.
4. Each team may only have 10 players in uniform.
5. There are no restrictions as to the number of substitutions or the number of entries for each player. Substitutions may only be made during a dead ball and must first check in with the scorer's table.

Mercy Rule:

Whenever there is a **Forty** point differential this is recorded as the final score in the game. At that point the scorekeeper will signal to stop the game and alert the officials and the coaches. After one minute the game will continue with the following rules in place.

1. Non-starters will be substituted for all starting players.
2. Defensively: no pressing defense. Half court man to man or zone only.
3. Timekeeper will maintain a running clock stopped only for injury or if the team behind in score calls a timeout.

Unsportsmanlike Behavior:

A players or coaches behavior that the referee would judge to be a disruptive influence on the game or be considered unsportsmanlike can result in a technical foul. A second technical will result in the player/ coach being removed for the game and the team bench for the remainder of that game and the next match. The coach must leave the gym for games he is removed from.

Tie Breaker:

1. The first tie breaker will be head to head between the tied teams.
2. The second tie breaker will be the point difference between the tied teams.
3. The third tie breaker will be least points conceded between the tied teams.
4. The 4th tie breaker will be least points conceded between all teams.

Uniforms:

The team listed first on the game schedule will be the home team.

Example: SIS vs. SOIS SIS would be the home team and will wear the light colored uniform.

Homestay Families:

Please communicate with your host families. Please let them know what time you will be at home, when you need to be picked up and where, and if you need dinner or not. Please feel free to let your host family know if you need anything and if there is a problem please let Mr. LaRue know. Be sure to have the school directions and phone numbers of the school, and the home address and phone numbers of your host. Remember that curfew for ALL players is 10:00pm even the students that live in Korea. Coaches from each team are required to phone all of there players each night of the tournament to insure that players are in the host home by 10:00pm.

Food:

Water is safe to drink in Korea. Food will be for sale throughout the day by our PTO. Students and coaches will need to make sure they have Korean Won to purchase food. Dinner on Thursday and Friday night will be purchased by students and on Saturday night dinner will be provided by KIS at the awards ceremony.
