- If a match finishes early, coin toss and warm-up for next match begins immediately.
- Coin toss: Winning team <u>either</u> chooses to serve or receive <u>or</u> chooses side of court.
   Losing team takes remaining choice. Winning team warms up first.
- Warm-up time (4-4-2): Coin toss-winning team gets full use of court <u>first</u> for 4 minutes for hitting practice while other team warms up on side. Other team then takes court for hitting practice for 4 minutes. Then, 2 minutes of serving warm-up for both teams simultaneously.
- Match length: best of 5 sets, rally scoring to 25. Fifth set (if necessary) to 15. A second coin toss to precede 5<sup>th</sup> set to determine who serves first.

## **Tournament Information**

#### Time schedule

- Shotgun schedule: listed times are approximate; matches may start early or late.
- Teams should be onsite at least 30 minutes prior to scheduled match time.
- If a match finishes early, coin toss and warmup for next match begins immediately. Be aware, be ready.
- Coin toss: Coaches, please have captains ready and prepare line-ups promptly.
- Coin-toss winning team <u>either</u> chooses to serve or receive <u>or</u> chooses side of court. Other team takes remaining choice. Winning team warms up first.
- Teams may wear either dark or light uniforms; no designation for home, away.

## Warm-up procedures (10 minutes: 4-4-2)

- Coin toss winning team gets full use of the court for 4 minutes for hitting practice while other team warms up on side.
- Other team then takes court for hitting practice for 4 minutes.
- Then, 2 minutes of serving warm-up for both teams simultaneously.

#### Rules

- FIVB <a href="http://www.fivb.com/">http://www.fivb.com/</a> (2017-18 rulebook), with modifications to be clarified in advance and to be discussed at initial coaches meeting.
- Best-of-5 matches; rally scoring to 25; 5<sup>th</sup> set (if necessary) to 15.
   (Exception: 5<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> place match is best of 3 sets.)
- Net height: 2.24 m / 7' 4 1/8"
- Substitutions: per set, 8 total "connected" substitutions a player can be substituted off the court only once and substituted back onto the court only once, and only for the same player.

### Tie breakers

If the 3 teams in the same pool finish round-robin play with identical 1 win–1 loss records, the tie breakers below will be used in order. Always, if only 2 teams are tied after a tie breaker, the next tie breaker is the head-to-head result.

- a. Set differential among tied teams (total sets won minus total sets lost), and then head-to-head if 2 teams are still tied.
- b. If 3 teams are still tied, then largest point differential among tied teams.
- c. If 3 teams are still tied, then most total points scored among tied teams.
- d. If 3 teams are still tied, then fewest total points allowed among tied teams.
- e. If 3 teams are still tied, then a coin toss.

#### Awards

- Traveling championship plaque.
- Keeper plaques for first, second, and third place.
- All-tournament team (12 players): 3 players each from 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> place teams, 2 players from 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place teams, 1 player from 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> place teams.

## Other information, reminders for all students

- Homestay guests: Please communicate clearly with homestay hosts. Tell them what time you will be home, what time you need to be at school, what time you need to be picked up, and if you need dinner or not. Feel free to ask your homestay family for help.
- Sabers players will act as guides for visiting players. Visiting overseas players must <u>not</u> travel alone; always be with your homestay host or a Sabers player.
- Homestay contact information, school directions: Please keep with you at all times.
- Curfew: 22:00 PM. In the homestay host family's home or in the school building.
- Off-limit areas: Virtually all school areas and classrooms are used by students and staff, both Friday and Saturday. Please be respectful of student learning.
- Hospitality room: E124 (green room) 1<sup>st</sup> floor, under the gym. Drinks, snacks, bento lunches for coaches, chaperones, referees.
- Medical: Nurse on site Friday on Saturday. Medical kit available.
- Ice machine: 1st floor, under the gym, near the PE office and weight room. Help yourself.
- Changing rooms, showers: 1st floor, under the gym.
- Warm-up area: Limited. Please use the upper level above the gym or a corner of the field outdoors. If outside, please avoid areas used by PE or Saturday School, and please wear outdoor shoes. On the upper level, please do not mess around with the strength training equipment.
- <u>Indoor shoes</u>: Please do not wear outdoor shoes in the gym on the main floor. Indoor shoes only. Outdoor shoes can be worn on the upper level above the gym.
- <u>Upper entrance</u>: During matches, spectators and non-playing players please enter/exit the gym via the upper entrance so as not to interfere with play.
- <u>Food and drink</u>: Tap water is safe to drink. Food and drink can be purchased from a number of nearby restaurants and convenience stores.
- <u>Food and drink</u>: No food or drink (other than drinks for matches) on the main gym level.
   Please take food and drink to the upper level.
- <u>Water fountains</u>: Located on the upper level above the gym and in school hallways. Please prepare your own water bottles.
- Drink machines: In the student lounge, opposite corner of the building from the gym.
- <u>Drink bottles</u>: Please empty partially full plastic drink bottles (outside or in sinks) and throw them away. Please do not put partially full plastic bottles in garbage cans.
- Garbage: Please keep the gym, sleeping rooms, and hallways clean of litter.
- <u>Taxis</u>: Teams, please arrange your own taxis. Call one day in advance (or earlier) to make sure taxis are available. Phone numbers are listed in this program.
- <u>Internet access via school's wi-fi</u>: "Join other network" (or something similar).
   Network ID: guest (No password.) Available in most areas, connection sometimes spotty.

# **Overnight sleeping rooms**

- Must be vacated during the day, Friday and Saturday, by 7:30 AM.
- Please do <u>not</u> enter rooms <u>before 18:00</u> Friday evening, unless it is clear that teachers have left.
- Curfew: Overnight teams, please return to school building by 21:45 PM.
- Do not wander around or "explore" the building; alarms may sound.
- Please keep rooms tidy. Full trash bags can be left in hallway.
- No eating or drinking in rooms, please. Thank you.
- Unfortunately, in-room eating, theft, damage, vandalism sometimes occur.
   Coaches, please supervise your teams closely.
- Futon storage: YIS (Friday, Saturday) theater <u>stage</u> off to the side;
   NIS (Saturday) theater <u>lobby</u> near big window.
- Return futons to genkan Sunday morning, properly folded, please.
