Tournament Information

Format

- Round-robin pool play (day 1) determines seedings for elimination play (day 2).
- 10-minute warm-up between games; be ready courtside.

Awards

- Traveling championship plaque.
- Keeper plaques for first, second and third place.
- All-tournament team (12 players): 3 players each from 1st and 2nd place teams,
 2 players from 3rd and 4th place teams,
 1 player from 5th and 6th place teams.

Rules

- FIBA <u>www.fiba.com</u> (2014, with some modifications, including closer three-point line, narrow rectangual lane, <u>no</u> no-charge semicircle, and others to be clarified in a separate document and discussed at coaches' meetings.)
- 8-minute quarters; 5-minute half-time; 4-minute overtime
- 10-player roster limit

Mercy rule

If one team reaches a 40-point lead, the scorekeeper will signal to stop the game and alert referees and coaches. The score at this point is recorded as the final score (for tie-break purposes). From this point, the leading team will make the changes stated below; these changes will remain in effect for the rest of the game or until the lead decreases to 25 points.

- Non-starters will substitute for <u>all</u> starting players.
- No pressing or trapping defenses: halfcourt defenses only (man or zone).
- Running clock. (Clock stops only at the end of a quarter and for injuries or timeouts.)

Tie breakers

If the 3 teams in the same pool finish round-robin play with identical 1 win–1 loss records, these tie breakers shall be used:

- Largest point differential, all 3 games (total points scored minus total points allowed;
 40 points maximum differential per game according to mercy rule)
- 2. If 2 teams are still tied, then head-to-head.
- 3. If 3 teams are still tied, then fewest total points allowed in all three games (and then head-to-head if two teams are still tied).
- 4. If 3 teams are still tied, then most total points scored in all three games (and then head-to-head if two teams are still tied).

Other information, reminders for all students

- Homestays: Please communicate clearly with your homestay hosts. Please tell them
 what time you will be home, what time you need to be at school, what time you need to
 be picked up, and if you need dinner or not. The general itinerary explains most things,
 but still communicate clearly. Feel free to ask your homestay family for any kind of help.
- <u>Buddies</u>: Sabers players will act as buddies to KIS and SIS players, directing them to restaurants and meeting points, and acting as general guides.
- School directions, homestay contact information: Please keep with you at all times.
- Curfew: 10:00 PM. In the homestay host family's home or in the school building.
- Off-limit areas: Virtually all areas and classrooms are used by students and staff, both Friday and Saturday. Please be respectful of student learning.
- Hospitality room: E124 (green room) 1st floor, under the gym. Drinks, snacks, bento lunches and computers for coaches, chaperones, and referees. No players – sorry.
- <u>Ice machine</u>: 1st floor, under the gym, near the PE office and weight room.
- Changing rooms, showers: 1st floor, under the gym
- <u>Warm-up area</u>: Limited. Please use the mezzanine level above the gym or a corner of the outside field. If outside, please avoid areas used by the Saturday School PE classes.
- <u>Food and drink</u>: Tap water is safe to drink. Food and drink can be purchased in the school cafeteria or from a number of nearby restaurants and convenience stores.
- <u>Water</u>: Please prepare your own water bottles. Water fountains are located in school hallways and on the mezzanine level above the gym.
- <u>Drink bottles</u>: Please empty partially full plastic drink bottles (outside or in sinks) and throw them away. Please do not put partially full plastic bottles in garbage cans or leave them in the gym.
- Drink machines: In the student lounge, opposite corner of the building from the gym.
- Garbage: Please keep the gym, sleeping rooms and hallways clean of litter.
- Internet access via school's wi-fi: "Join other network" (or something similar).
 Network ID: guest (No password.)
 Available in most areas, though connection is sometimes spotty.

Overnight sleeping rooms

- a. Must be vacated during the day, Friday and Saturday, by 7:30 AM.
- b. Please do <u>not</u> enter the rooms <u>before 6:30 PM</u> Thursday or Friday evenings, unless it is clear that the teacher has vacated the room.
- c. <u>Overnight accommodation information</u> can be found on the Sabers athletic website at <u>sabers.senri.ed.ip</u>.
