Tournament Regulations

Format, timing

- Round-robin pool play (day 1) determines seedings for elimination play (day 2).
- 2nd and 3rd place teams play quarterfinal games; 1st place teams receive byes (day 2).
- Saturday: Shotgun schedule. Times listed are approximate. Games might start early.
- Saturday: 15 minutes between games; teams be ready courtside for warmup.

Awards

- Traveling championship plaque (currently held by SOIS).
- Keeper plaques for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place.
- All-tournament team (12 players): 3 players each from 1st and 2nd place teams, 2 players from 3rd and 4th place teams, 1 player from 5th and 6th place teams.

Rules

- FIBA 2018: http://sabers.senri.ed.jp/fiba.html
- FIBA regulation-width lane (black lines); closer NFHS 3-point line (purple line).
- 8-minute quarters; 2-minute quarter break; 5-minute halftime; 4-minute overtime. (Exceptions: 5th-6th place game: 6-minute quarters.)
- 10-player roster limit.

Mercy rule

If a team reaches a 40-point lead, the scorekeeper signals to stop the game and alerts referees and coaches. The score at this point is recorded as the final score (for tie-break purposes). From this point, the leading team makes the changes stated below; these changes remain in effect for the rest of the game or until the lead decreases to 25 points.

- Non-starters substitute for all starting players.
- No pressing or trapping defenses; halfcourt zone defenses only.
- No fast breaks.
- Running clock. (Clock stops only at end of quarter and for injuries or timeouts.)
- Shot clock in use.

Tie breakers

If the 3 teams in the same pool finish round-robin play with identical 1 win–1 loss records, these tie breakers shall be used in order:

- 1. Largest point differential, both games (total points scored minus total points allowed; 40 points maximum differential per game according to mercy rule).
- 2. If 2 teams are still tied, then the head-to-head results breaks the tie.
- 3. If 3 teams are still tied, then fewest total points allowed in both games (and then head-to-head if 2 teams are still tied).
- 4. If 3 teams are still tied, then most total points scored in both games (and then head-to-head if 2 teams are still tied).

Other information, reminders for all students

- Visiting players must not travel alone. Stay with your homestay host or a Sabers player.
- <u>Homestay guests</u>: Please communicate clearly with homestay hosts. Tell them what time you will be home, what time you need to be at school, what time you need to be picked up, and if you need dinner or not. Feel free to ask your homestay family for help.
- Homestay contact information, school directions: Please keep with you at all times.
- Curfew: 10:00 PM. In the homestay host family's home or in the school building.
- Off-limit areas: Virtually all areas and classrooms are used by students and staff.
 Please be respectful of student learning.
- <u>Hospitality room</u>: A240 (AD office; 2nd floor, gym level) Drinks, snacks, bento lunches for coaches, chaperones, referees.
- <u>Ice machine</u>: 1st floor, under the gym, near the PE office and weight room. Help yourself.
- Changing rooms, showers: 1st floor, under the gym.
- <u>Indoor shoes</u>: Please do not wear outdoor shoes in the gym on the main floor. Indoor shoes only. Outdoor shoes can be worn on the upper level above the gym.
- <u>Food and drink I</u>: Nor food or drink (other than drinks for games), including coffee, on the gym main level, please.
- Upper level: Outdoor shoes, food and drink OK.
- <u>Upper entrance</u>: During games, spectators please enter/exit the gym via the upper (3rd floor) entrance so as not to interfere with the game.
- <u>Warm-up area</u>: Limited. Please use the upper level of the gym or a corner of the outside field. If outside, please avoid areas used by PE classes. Wear outdoor shoes.
- <u>Water</u>: Bottled water will be provided to each team (one case per day). For more water, please prepare your own bottles. Water fountains are located in school hallways and on the upper level of the gym.
- <u>Food and drink II</u>: Tap water is safe to drink. Food and drink can be purchased in the school cafeteria or from a number of nearby restaurants and convenience stores.
- <u>Drink machines</u>: In the student lounge, opposite corner of the building from the gym.
- <u>Bottles</u>: Please empty partially full plastic drink bottles (outside or in sinks) and throw them away. Please do not put partially full plastic bottles in garbage cans.
- <u>Garbage</u>: Please keep the gym, sleeping rooms, and hallways clean of litter.
- <u>Internet access via school's wi-fi</u>: "Join other network" (or something similar).

 Network ID: **guest** (No password.) *Available in most areas, connection sometimes spotty.*

- Coaches, please supervise students at all times. Please check the cleanliness of your team's sleeping room.
- Do not enter rooms before 18:00 PM, unless teachers have vacated rooms.
- Vacate sleeping rooms entirely by 7:30 AM Friday and Saturday mornings.
- Store futons Friday and Saturday on the <u>theater stage</u>.
- Return futons Sunday morning to the *genkan* front lobby area.
