AISA GIRLS SOCCER TOURNAMENT 2013

Rules

FIFA rules & AISA Handbook

Rosters

Teams will be a maximum of 15 players with 11 players on the field.

Playing time

All matches are 2 x 30-minute halves with a 10-minute halftime break. 20 minute warm-up between games.

Yellow and red cards

Referees may issue yellow and red cards for foul play, excessive complaining, swearing and other unsportsmanlike conduct. A player receiving a **red card** or a **second yellow card** will be **ejected** from the match (no replacement permitted) and **suspended** from the next match.

Substitutions

Unlimited substitution. Either team may substitute on goal, a corner kick or a free kick. Only the team in possession may substitute on a throw-in or goal kick.

Uniforms

Teams should have dark and light colored uniforms with numbers on the front and back.

Officials

Local ENKOR officials will be used for all matches.

Round Robin tie breakers

- Points from round-robin play determine seeding for 3rd and 4th game as well as the championship game.
- **Round Robin points:** Win = 3 points; Loss = 0 points; Draw = 1 point.
- **Tie breakers:** If two or three teams finish round-robin play with the same number of points, these tie breakers shall be used in the following order:
 1. Head-to-head results.
 2. Goal differential among tied teams (total goals scored minus total goals allowed; maximum 5-goal differential per game).
 3. Most goals scored among tied teams (maximum 5 per match).
 4. Fewest goals allowed among tied teams (maximum 5 goals per match).
 5. Goal differential in all games (maximum 5 goals per match).
 6. Most goals scored in games (maximum 5 goals per match).
 7. Fewest goals allowed in all games (maximum 5 goals per match)
 8. Penalty kick shoot-out.

Penalty kicks, extra time:

- No extra time for any round-robin play or championship matches (to prevent tournament play from running overtime).
- No penalty kicks for round-robin matches; round-robin matches may end in a tie.
- Penalty kicks in elimination matches only (3rd vs. 4th game, & championship):
 - a. PKs will be taken by 5 players (selected from those players who were playing at the end of the match) from each team.
 - b. Winner of a coin flip chooses to kick first or defer.
 - c. The penalty kicks shall be taken alternately.
 - d. Each kick shall be taken by a different player and all eligible players shall take a kick before any player may take a second kick.
 - e. If, before both teams have taken 5 kicks, one has scored more goals than the other could score from all 5 of its kicks, no more kicks shall be taken.
 - f. If a tie still exists after 5 kicks, the goalkeeper may be changed.
 - g. If a tie still exists after 5 kicks, sudden-death penalty kicks will be taken by players who have not already kicked.

Unsportsmanlike Behavior:

A player's or coaches behavior that the referee would judge to be a disruptive influence on the match or be considered unsportsmanlike can result in a yellow or red card. Yellow is considered a warning. A second yellow or a red will result in the player/coach being removed for the game and the team bench for the remainder of that game and the next match.

Homestay Families:

Please communicate with your host families. Please let them know what time you will be at home, when you need to be picked up and where, and if you need dinner or not. Please feel free to let your host family know if you need anything and if there is a problem please let Mr. LaRue know. Be sure to have the school directions and phone numbers of the school, and the home address and phone numbers of your host with you at all times. Remember that curfew for ALL players is 10:00pm even the students that live in Korea. Coaches from each team are required to phone all of there players each night of the tournament to insure that players are in the host home by 10:00pm.
